WE GATHER

"The land upon which we gather is part of the traditional territory of the Lenni-Lenape, called 'Lenapehoking.' The Lenape People lived in harmony with one another upon this territory for thousands of years. During the colonial era and early federal period, many were removed west and north, but some also remain among the continuing historical tribal communities of the region: The Nanticoke Lenni-Lenape Tribal Nation; the Ramapough Lenape Nation; and the Powhatan Lenape Nation, The Nanticoke of Millsboro Delaware, and the Lenape of Cheswold Delaware. We acknowledge the Lenni-Lenape as the original people of this land and their continuing relationship with their territory. In our acknowledgment of the continued presence of Lenape people in their homeland, we affirm the aspiration of the great Lenape Chief Tamanend, that there be harmony between the indigenous people of this land and the descendants of the immigrants to this land, "as long as the rivers and creeks flow, and the sun, moon, and stars shine."



Food Pantry: Tuesdays; 2pm - 5pm - BY APPOINTMENT ONLY

Appointments are available via the <u>Plentiful App</u> (download from the play/app store). You can search for us, in the app, by name "The Red Door Place" or scroll through the list (towards the bottom) and our pantry will show. After registering on the app, you will receive a QR code - **BRING the QR code with you to your appointment**.

Arrive within 5 minutes of your scheduled appointment and present your QR code for scanning. **If you do not have a QR code, you will not receive pantry.** Note: Missed appointments can be rescheduled to a later open slot or the following Tuesday. If you have any questions call 347-497-9718 and ask for Teresa.

Community Meal: We will continue to hand out bags of food on Saturdays beginning around 11:30am. Guests may arrive earlier to get a place in line; we have chalk marks on the sidewalk at 6-foot intervals to indicate where people should stand at a safe distance.

50 Years of Creating a Caring, Just, and Affirming World for LGBTQ+ People and Those Who Love Them

The Church of the Village is honored to join with Village Preservation and PFLAG NYC to celebrate the 50th anniversary of the founding of PFLAG. This is a free community event at the location where this happened. Join us for a conversation about the history, impact, and legacy of this trailblazing organization. Our panel of speakers includes Rev. Jeff Wells of the Church of the Village and Clark Wolff Hamel, PFLAG NYC's Manager of Educational Programs.

Founded in Greenwich Village in 1973, PFLAG (formerly Parents and Friends of Lesbians and Gays) calls itself "the nation's largest organization dedicated to supporting, educating, and advocating for LGBTQ+ people and those who love them."

In June 1972, Jeanne Manford marched in the Christopher Street Liberation Day Parade (the forerunner of today's annual LGBTQ+ Pride March) with her son, gay activist, Morty Manford, holding a sign which said "Parents of Gays: Unite in Support of Our Children." She received an immediate positive response from the crowd.

According to Rev. Ed Egan, then the pastor of Metropolitan Duane United Methodist Church (MDUMC), the idea for what was initially called "Parents of Gays" arose in a discussion after a symposium sponsored by the "Homosexual Community Counseling Center" on January 22, 1973. After the symposium, Jeanne and Morty Manford, Roy Byrd (pseudonym of a young Gay mental health counselor), his parents, and Rev. Edward Egan gathered for an informal conversation. As Ed Egan wrote later, "We sensed the need for an ongoing work with, by and for parents of Gays. We agreed to meet at MDUMC (now The Church of the Village) on Sunday afternoon, March 31, 1973, open as to where we would go from there."

The power of PFLAG was born from the love of Jeanne Manford for her Gay son, along with Rev. Egan and a small group of committed parents. A unified front of LGBTQ+ people, parents, families, and non-family allies continues to fuel PFLAG's mission 50 years later. Come and hear more about the history and the current work of PFLAG.
