WE GATHER

"The land upon which we gather is part of the traditional territory of the Lenni-Lenape, called "Lenapehoking." The Lenape People lived in harmony with one another upon this territory for thousands of years. During the colonial era and early federal period, many were removed west and north, but some also remain among the continuing historical tribal communities of the region: The Nanticoke Lenni-Lenape Tribal Nation; the Ramapough Lenape Nation; and the Powhatan Renape Nation, The Nanticoke of Millsboro Delaware, and the Lenape of Cheswold Delaware. We acknowledge the Lenni-Lenape as the original people of this land and their continuing relationship with their territory. In our acknowledgment of the continued presence of Lenape people in their homeland, we affirm the aspiration of the great Lenape Chief Tamanend, that there be harmony between the indigenous people of this land and the descendants of the immigrants to this land, "as long as the rivers and creeks flow, and the sun, moon, and stars shine."

In the steps of: Louise Fawcett

Louise Fawcett (nee Rhudy) grew up in West Virginia as the daughter of a Methodist pastor who served several churches. She recalls riding with her father from church to church on Sundays and giving him feedback on his sermons! Their family lived on a small farm and she recalls singing to one of their pigs, who apparently appreciated the music greatly. She spent a few years as a young woman working for regional church organizations and living on the road. Louise later attended Drew Seminary in Madison, NJ, where she met her husband-to-be, Neal Fawcett. They spent five years living in Germany where Louise worked at a nearby Army base teaching soldiers and arranging events for the spouses of the military personnel serving there. Upon their return to the US, Neal served a church in Teaneck, NJ. Eventually they moved to Brooklyn, where Louise still resides. Neal died of lung cancer decades ago; Louise and Neal have a son, Greg.

Louise's professional life in the US included working with the General Board of Global Ministries and the United Methodist Women in several leadership positions. She traveled and led conferences and events all over the world.

Louise became a member of Washington Square United Methodist Church, one of the progenitor communities which helped to form the Church of the Village, in the 1970's. She was an active member, helping with many projects. Upon her retirement, Louise took over the management of the food program at Washington Square UMC, then titled "Martha's Kitchen" and grew the program.

When the Church of the Village was created by the joining of three Greenwich Village Methodist communities in 2005, the food programs of the churches also merged. Louise worked tirelessly to create ways for this important community service to adapt and grow. It is due to her efforts, along with others such as Dwight Campbell and Don Quigley, that the program Hope for our Neighbors in Need became a steady beacon of aid. In 2006, Louise was honored as an "angel" of the program. Now re-christened The Red Door Place in 2020, this program continues to serve thousands of people each week.

For many years, Louise coordinated the Ministers of Care at Church of the Village, assuring that church members in each borough had a person who cared and kept in touch with their needs. Louise has served on countless committees for our congregation and been a part of our local United Methodist Women group. Over the years she has quietly advocated for assistance to many members and friends who required a helping hand - finding small grants, raising funds, visiting folks, bringing home-cooked food and more.

Louise, now 89 years old, is a true "matriarch" of our community!

John 20:19-31 (The Inclusive Bible)

In the evening of that same day, the first day of the week, the doors were locked in the room where the disciples were, for fear of the Temple authorities. Jesus came and stood among them and said, "Peace be with you." Having said this, the Savior showed them the marks of crucifixion.

The disciples were filled with joy when they saw Jesus, who said to them again, "Peace be with you. As Abba God sent me, so I'm sending you." After saying this, Jesus breathed on them and said, "Receive the Holy Spirit. If you forgive anyone's sins, they are forgiven. If you retain anyone's sins, they are retained."

It happened that one of the Twelve, Thomas – nicknamed Didymus, or "Twin" – was absent when Jesus came. The other disciples kept telling him, "We've seen Jesus!" Thomas' answer was, "I'll never believe it without putting my finger in the nail marks and my hand into the spear wound."

On the eighth day, the disciples were once more in the room, and this time Thomas was with them. Despite the locked doors, Jesus came and stood before them, saying, "Peace be with you." Then, Jesus said to Thomas, "Take your finger and examine the wound in my hands. Put your hand into the wound on my side. Don't persist in your unbelief, but believe!"

Thomas said in response, "My Savior and my God!" Jesus then said, "You've become a believer because you saw me. Blessed are those who have not seen and yet have believed." Jesus performed many other signs as well – signs not recorded here – in the presence of the disciples. But these have been recorded to help you believe that Jesus is the Messiah, the Only Begotten, so that by believing you may have life in Jesus' name.



Donations, in person, to the program can be made Mondays, Tuesdays, Fridays, and Saturdays, from 9am to 3pm. Ring the bell on the red door on 13th street or call the number posted at the door.

Food Pantry: Tuesdays from 3:30 – 5:30pm. No early line up permitted before 3pm. Lineup will begin behind the rope at 3pm on the corner of 7th Avenue and 13th Street.

We will continue to hand out bags of food on Saturdays beginning around 11:30am. Guests may

arrive earlier to get a place in line; we have chalk marks on the sidewalk at 6-foot intervals to indicate where people should stand at a safe distance.

THE RED DOOR PLACE – NEEDS MONEY FOR FOOD!

The huge increase in unemployment and homelessness means that The Red Door Place has gone from providing food for 1,700 persons before the pandemic, to 2,500 in April, to now more than *4,000 persons every week*. TRDP has plenty of volunteers. **What we need is money.** We are desperately trying to keep enough food coming in to give out to every guest. TRDP is one of only a few emergency food programs in Manhattan still giving out a significant amount of food to each guest at the pantry on Tuesdays and still offering a hot meal on Saturdays.

OUR ADVENTURE IN ONLINE-ONSITE COMMUNITY



The Church of the Village never "closed" during the Covid-19 pandemic because we shifted our entire ministry to be online in March 2020. Then, as the world began slowly to emerge in the summer of 2021 from the worst of the pandemic, there was no thought among the Church of the Village leadership of "going back" to the way of "doing church" before the pandemic.

Our reality and our reach have changed dramatically in a year. We continue to attract worshippers and receive new members from across the U.S. and beyond its borders, as well as from the New York City area. As a faith community, the Church of the Village is no longer tied to a building. We opened to all of our vaccinated members in September 2021 and to the public in December 2021. Currently, we are still practicing masking and social distancing but not requiring proof of vaccination to enter the building.

People are attracted to the Church of the Village because of our progressive theology, radical inclusivity, extravagant welcome, and focus on social, economic, and climate justice. Many who worship with us or decide to join cannot find this sort of faith community where they live.
